
Website Launched!

- To summarise, this was a major undertaking by a large extended team, and we are very grateful to everyone who contributed. <u>Acknowledgements</u>





"Overall my expectation was it could apply on pupils' behavioural issues in autism. My focus is on their bad habits, etc. However, this program does help me to be aware that we need to build trust and a secure environment for them before they can share their emotion and needs rather than tantrums. I do find I learnt a lot about self-awareness on how to handle pupils with their self-esteem, relationships, friendship and communication......It will be a good tool for me to use to find the root cause of my pupils' anxiety, emotional problems fear etc. My plan is to give inhouse sharing with all the teachers in Miri and I try to apply to a few of my students."
